

## Example #3 – DOUBLE-NAT caused by DSL Modem/Router

This Double NAT scenario is caused by the DSL modem also being a router. This means the DSL modem has a firewall like your router and is also blocking ports inbound to your network. Calling your DSL provider and asking them to put your modem in “bridge mode” will typically solve this problem.



**THE FIX:** Calling your DSL ISP and ask them to make sure your DSL modem is in BRIDGE MODE. This will remove the firewall in the DSL modem/router and make it just a modem. Your router will then control all the ports from the Internet giving you complete control of your network.
